Louisiana Federal-Aid Highway Program Stewardship Agreement 2007

(Amendment #1)

Developed in Partnership by the Federal Highway Administration and the Louisiana Department of Transportation and Development







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I. INTRODUCTION

The American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009 (ARRA) was signed into law on February 17, 2009. This law provides significant funding for, among other programs, transportation infrastructure. LADOTD's allocation for highway improvements totaled \$429,859,427.

The ARRA legislation has mandated strict timeframes for funding obligations. All of the funds must be obligated within one year of the apportionment to LADOTD; however, 50% of the non-suballocated funds, or \$183,037,619, must be obligated within 120 days of the apportionment. Failure to meet these timeframes will result in LADOTD losing its unobligated balance. In addition, the legislation has set forth specific project eligibility and selection criteria as well as requiring monthly reporting of project data.

With these additional stipulations placed on the use of ARRA funds, LADOTD employee workloads will increase quickly, resources could approach capacity, and the use of proper contract administration procedures/processes may be tested. These conditions result in additional risks being associated with the delivery of ARRA-funded projects.

LADOTD fully intends to carryout ARRA projects in accordance with the September 2007 Stewardship and Oversight Plan. However, LADOTD recognizes the additional risks that exist with the delivery of the ARRA program and understands FHWA's obligation to enhance their oversight; particularly with "state delegated" projects. LADOTD agrees to fully cooperate with FHWA in carrying out the activities set forth in this plan.







II. DELEGATION OF ARRA FUNDED PROJECTS

The following table defines oversight responsibility for Federal-Aid projects funded fully or partially with ARRA funds in Louisiana.

Note 2: Locally Administered Projects = Local Public Agency Projects (i.e., Parish, Municipality).

Exceptions:

- State Administered projects (delegated) may be selected for full oversight by mutual
 agreement between FHWA & LADOTD. The selection will be agreed upon by the FHWA
 Assistant Division Administrator and the LADOTD Chief Engineer. Examples of projects
 which may be selected: Major or complex bridge structure projects, or projects which
 involve a high degree of public controversy or environmental impacts.
- A full oversight project may be delegated by mutual agreement between FHWA & LADOTD. The selection will be agreed upon by the FHWA Assistant Division Administrator and the LADOTD Chief Engineer. Examples of projects likely to be selected: NHS projects which do not affect traffic such as landscaping, rest area construction, fencing, signing, and enhancement projects.







III. PURPOSE OF PROJECT OVERSIGHT PLAN

The purpose of this plan is to (1) ensure the FHWA Louisiana Division provides the necessary stewardship of those funds made available to Louisiana through the ARRA, (2) to establish additional project oversight measures to ensure compliance with project eligibility, and reporting requirements, and (3) to support the Division's risk management plan developed specifically to deliver the ARRA program in Louisiana.

It is important to note that this plan will supplement, not replace, our existing Stewardship and Oversight Plan with LADOTD. While the primary roles and responsibilities outlined in our September 2007 plan will remain intact in carrying out ARRA funded projects, this plan outlines additional actions that the FHWA LA Division and LADOTD will undertake to ensure ARRA funds are obligated and expended in accordance with both Title 23 United States Code and the specific requirements stipulated in the ARRA.







IV. ENHANCED STEWARDSHIP AND OVERSIGHT FOR ARRA PROGRAM AND PROJECT ACTIVITIES

As stated previously, it is intended for all ARRA projects to be administered in accordance with our existing Stewardship and Oversight Plan. It is anticipated that over 80% of LADOTD's ARRA funding will be applied to "state delegated" projects. However, it is recognized that the spending of ARRA funds will be under high scrutiny from both the public and political officials, as well as government oversight agencies. Therefore, both LADOTD and FHWA recognize that special attention and visibility is needed during the delivery of the entire ARRA program.

1. PROGRAM ACTIVITIES

Planning activities for ARRA funded projects will continue as they do for all other federally assisted projects. Amendments incorporating ARRA projects into LADOTD's STIP will be reviewed by the appropriate individual within the LA Division Program Delivery Team for eligibility, fiscal capacity and constraint, transportation conformity, coordination with MPO TIPS, and public involvement.

Environmental activities for ARRA funded projects will continue as they do for all other federally assisted projects. All NEPA reviews and approvals will follow existing procedures including our Programmatic CE Agreement with LADOTD.

Right of Way acquisition for ARRA projects must comply with 49 CFR 24 (the Uniform Act). Furthermore, the requirements set forth in 23 CFR 710 must be followed if ARRA funding is used for property acquisition. The Division Realty Officer understands the significance of the ARRA legislation and the importance to successfully deliver the program. Therefore, our Realty Officer will initiate additional oversight activities to include (1) incorporating ARRA projects as part of scheduled ROW compliance reviews and (2) participating in LADOTD/FHWA joint compliance ROW reviews on selected ARRA projects.

Financial activities for ARRA funded projects will be similar to the processes for all other federally assisted projects. The Finance Team provides the initial review of all projects to be sure that the authorization is complete, accurate and that all ARRA requirements are present in the authorization. The Finance Team will monitor all ARRA authorizations and expenditures, provide status reports, and help ensure that all ARRA financial deadlines are met to avoid the loss of any ARRA funding. The Division recognizes the heightened financial scrutiny that ARRA projects will receive. To that end, an ARRA billing review will be performed on projects billed during fiscal year 2009 and additional billing reviews will be performed regularly during each year of ARRA funding as more projects incur expenditures. In addition, ARRA projects will be incorporated as a part of regular financial compliance reviews and as a part of the FIRE program.

2. PROJECT ACTIVITIES

In order to minimize the potential risks associated with ARRA-funded projects, the FHWA will implement additional measures to increase FHWA's stewardship and project oversight activities. Special emphasis has been placed on activities associated with the obligation of ARRA funding as well as enhanced oversight initiatives on "state delegated" projects. The additional measures







that will be implemented include the use of a project tracking system, utilization of a project authorization checklist, and conducting a series of project phase reviews of those ARRA projects categorized as "state delegated."

- a. Project Tracking System An electronic system has been developed to capture all necessary project data for all projects with ARRA funding. This system will assist FHWA in verifying project eligibility, monitoring authorized/award project costs versus project costs allocated in the STIP, and verify the submittal of monthly reports.
- b. Project Authorization Checklist An authorization checklist has been developed and will be used for all ARRA project funding authorization requests. By using this checklist, the risks associated with the funding obligation phase will be minimized. The checklist will require the FHWA approving official to verify that the authorization request is complete and accurate. Items that will be verified include but are not limited to: consistency with LADOTD's 1511 Certification, compliance with STIP, and that the request includes the required statements set forth in the ARRA.
- c. Project Phase Reviews FHWA will conduct phase reviews of all Full Oversight projects and a selected sample of "state delegated" ARRA projects (see attached tables) for three specific project development phases: (a) PS&E package, (b) Bid evaluation/contract award, and (c) Construction. It is anticipated that project phase reviews will continue through fiscal year 2011. LADOTD understands the need for these reviews and agrees to fully cooperate with FHWA as they are carried out. All reviews will be documented with copies of reviews provided to LADOTD. ARRA projects categorized as Full Oversight projects will be reviewed in accordance with the Louisiana Federal-Aid Highway Program Stewardship Agreement approved in 2007.
 - i. <u>PS&E Checklist:</u> This review will be conducted on all Full Oversight projects and a selected sample of "state delegated" ARRA projects (see attached tables) prior to project authorization/advertisement. LADOTD will be notified of the project PS&E packages to be reviewed at the time that they would be expected to complete the package. This review will be made to assess the quality and completeness of these PS&E packages evaluated. LADOTD will be notified promptly of any findings. The review will assure the projects have met the Recovery Act requirements, General Federal-Aid compliance, plans constructability and clearness, project specifications, and engineer's estimate reasonability. A checklist has been developed for use during this review phase. (See Appendix A)
 - ii. <u>Local Public Agency Federal-Aid Projects Checklist:</u> This review will be conducted on all Full Oversight locally administered projects and a selected sample of "state delegated" ARRA locally administered projects (see attached tables) prior to project authorization/advertisement. LADOTD will be notified of the project PS&E packages to be reviewed at the time that they would be expected to complete the package. This review will be made to assess the quality and completeness of these PS&E packages evaluated. LADOTD will be notified promptly of any findings. The review will assure the sample projects have met the planning and environmental, Right of way and utility clearance, plans and specifications completeness, engineer's estimate reasonability, and proposal includes all Federal-Aid and Recovery Act (ARRA) requirements. A checklist has been developed for use during this review phase. (See Appendix A)







- iii. <u>Disadvantage Business Enterprise Checklist:</u> All Full Oversight projects and a selected sample of "state delegated" ARRA projects (see attached tables) will be reviewed during active construction to assess compliance with contract DBE goals, "good faith" efforts, commercially useful functions, wages complaints, and project bulletin boards information requirements. A checklist has been developed for use during this review phase to be included as part of the inspection report. (See Appendix A)
- iv. Quality Assurance Checklist: All Full Oversight projects and a selected sample of "state delegated" ARRA projects (see attached table) will be reviewed during active construction to assess the project staffing by the State or Local Agency, contractor's workmanship, and adequate project record keeping. The frequency of project inspections will vary depending on project scope and size, but it will be no less than one (1) visit for delegated projects. LADOTD or Local Agency Representatives will be promptly notified of any issues or concerns. Additional actions and/or follow-up reviews will be determined based on the findings during the first review. A checklist has been developed for use during this review phase to be included as part of the inspection report. (See Appendix A)
- v. <u>Contract Administration Checklist</u>. Concurrence in contract award will remain as set forth in our Stewardship and Oversight Plan. LADOTD will continue to request concurrence in awards for Full oversight ARRA funded projects. However, the FHWA will required that LADOTD submits a copy of the bid package on all state delegated projects to assist with the independent review of the bid data for each of the ARRA funded projects. This review will check the bid information and a bid analysis will be performed to assess competition on ARRA funded projects. LADOTD will be promptly notified of any issues or concerns. A checklist has been developed for use during this review phase. (See Appendix A)

Furthermore, additional projects may be added based on project size or complexity, and/or environmental sensitivity.

Both the FHWA LA Division and LADOTD fully appreciate the significance of the ARRA legislation and the importance of successfully delivering the program. While the enhanced activities outlined in this plan will be implemented, the FHWA LA Division and LADOTD will remain cognizant of the status of all Louisiana ARRA projects and consider them as additional oversight opportunities become available. Additional oversight opportunities include the following:

- Include ARRA projects as part of scheduled follow-up reviews in assessing compliance with implemented FY08 process review action plans.
- Include ARRA projects as part of FY09 scheduled process reviews.
- Include ARRA projects in upcoming LADOTD Quality Management Team reviews.
- Both FHWA Division and LADOTD Headquarters staff will periodically provide contact visits of ARRA projects during normal District visits.
- Consider ARRA projects as part of the LADOTD/FHWA biannual Traffic Control Reviews.







Louisiana Stewardship Agreement

FHWA and LADOTD mutually agree to the delegations defined in this section of the Stewardship Agreement as allowed by Title 23 Section 106 and further agree to abide by the procedures, practices, and business standards outlined throughout this Stewardship Agreement.
