PUBLIC MEETING SUMMARY

A second public meeting was held on November 1, 2018 for the Cane River Bridge Church Street Route LA 1-X project. The meeting was held as an informal open house format with multiple stations for participants to visit with project team members.

MEETING OBJECTIVES

The objective of the public meeting was to provide updated information to the public and seek input from individuals and community organizations regarding potential impacts associated with the proposed replacement of the Cane River Bridge at Church Street located in Natchitoches Parish, Louisiana.

MEETING ADVERTISEMENT

The public meeting was advertised in several ways. Property owners within the project vicinity, citizens who responded to the Solicitation of Views, and citizens who offered comments at the first public meeting were mailed a meeting notice on September 27, 2018. Notices of the meeting were advertised in The Natchitoches Times and the Natchitoches Parish Journal on Thursday, October 18, 2018 and Thursday, October 25, 2018. Agencies and stakeholders were emailed on September 26, 2018 and mailed a notice on September 27, 2018. Press releases were posted on the LADOTD project website on October 23, 2018. Various newspapers and news stations also advertised the public meeting. Copies of the advertisements are included in the Appendix.

MEETING FORMAT

The meeting followed an informal open house format. Five (5) Stations were organized around the meeting facility and are described below:

- **Welcome and Sign-In**. Meeting attendees were asked to provide their contact information. They also received a project handout describing the project and the project history, figures showing the proposed improvements, an overview of the open house format, and a comment form. Copies of the meeting handouts are included in the Appendix.
- **Presentation**. Meeting attendees were able to watch a 30-minute presentation to familiarize themselves about the project history, the development of various alternatives, the current proposed alternatives, the preliminary environmental impacts, and the project timeline. The presentation played on a continuous loop. A copy of the presentation is included in the Appendix.
- **Exhibits**. Meeting attendees were able to visit with project team members to ask questions and to view the bridge alternatives, typical sections, detour layouts, vibration monitoring, cultural resources, and noise exhibits. Copies of the exhibits are included in the Appendix.
- **Right of Way Information**. Property owners in attendance had the opportunity to speak with a team member to discuss the LADOTD's acquisition of right of way and relocation assistance program.
- **Comments**. Meeting attendees were able to fill out comment forms or record a verbal comment on the voice recorder provided at the station.

MEETING SUMMARY

The meeting was attended by thirty-eight (38) citizens, twenty-one (21) governmental or elected officials, sixteen (16) agency representatives, two (2) media personnel, and five (5) project team members.

Public Comments

Comment forms were handed out to each attendee when signing into the meeting. During the open house format meeting, attendees were able to turn in a completed written comment form or record a verbal comment on a voice recorder coordinated by one of the project team members. Attendees and persons who received invitations were also able to provide comments via email or mail. Comments were received through November 12, 2018. The public meeting comment summary table is included in the Appendix and a summary of responses received are below.

Comment Summary

Eleven (11) written comments were received at the public meeting held on November 1, 2018. Four (4) comments were received following the public meeting through the end of the comment period on November 12, 2018. 


FIGURE 4: Proposed Cane River Replacement Bridge Typical Section



Brief Project History:

In 1998, LADOTD initiated the Stage 1 Environmental Process, proposing to replace the existing bridge due to structural and geometric deficiencies. The first public meeting was held in 1999. The project was put on hold while LADOTD examined rehabilitation of the existing bridge. In 2001, the Natchitoches City Council passed a resolution in favor of the project. A rehabilitation study was completed in April 2002. Ultimately, the project was put on hold due to controversy in 2003. Bridge repairs were made in January 2004. A bridge taskforce was developed at the request of Mayor Lee Posey, and their first meeting was held in October 2013. The bridge taskforce analyzed impacts and coordinated with the public to refine alternatives. In 2015, LADOTD requested to initiate the Phase 1 Environmental Process. A Stage 0 report was developed, which included a preliminary purpose and need statement and initial project conceptual alternatives, which are discussed below.

Conceptual Alternatives Development:

The following alternatives, developed from the original environmental process and refined by the Bridge Taskforce, were advanced to the Phase 0 Feasibility process:

- Construction of a new bridge aligned with St. Clair Avenue utilizing either:
- i. Phased construction maintaining traffic along the existing alignment
- ii. Construction of a temporary detour bridge at Highland Park
- · Construction of a new bridge maintaining the existing alignment with a detour bridge at Highland Park

At the time the Stage 0 was produced, local governments discussed providing additional funding to construct a permanent bridge at Highland Park. This option was omitted as the Natchitoches City Council voted against funding in December

LADOTD awarded a contract to re-initiate the Cane River Bridge EA in 2017, views were solicited in June 2017, and the first public meeting was held in December 2017. The following alternatives determined to be reasonable were presented at the first public meeting:

- 1 Replace Cane River Bridge on a skewed alignment utilizing staged construction
- 1A Replace Cane River Bridge on a skewed alignment with a temporary bridge located at Highland Park
- 1B Replace Cane River Bridge on a skewed alignment with a temporary bridge located at Touline Street
- 2 Replace Cane River Bridge on the same alignment utilizing staged construction
- 2A Replace Cane River Bridge on the same alignment with a temporary bridge located at Highland Park
- 2B Replace Cane River Bridge on the same alignment with a temporary bridge located at Touline Street

Public comments were solicited, and 22 of the 47 comments opposed a temporary bridge at Highland Park, thus this alternative was eliminated as a result of both documented public opposition and development of an additional alternative providing less impacts. The refined alternatives are provided on the next

All alternatives below propose to replace the existing Cane River Bridge with a three lane section including two 12-ft. wide travel lanes and a 12-ft. wide center turning lane, 4-ft. wide outside shoulders, and two 6-ft. wide sidewalks with barriers. The temporary bridge at Touline Street will consist of two 12-ft. lanes. There are five total alternatives, including the No-Build.

Alternative 1: The proposed alternative will replace the existing Cane River Bridge on a skewed alignment. This alternative ties the east end of the Cane River Bridge directly into St. Clair Avenue, eliminating the existing offset intersection. In addition, a temporary bridge is proposed at Touline Street so that traffic is redirected temporarily.

Alternative 2: The proposed alternative will replace the existing Cane River Bridge along the same alignment. In addition, a temporary bridge is proposed at Touline Street so that traffic is redirected temporarily.

Alternative 3: This proposed alternative will demolish the existing two-lane Cane River Bridge and replace it on a skewed alignment. This alternative ties the east end of the Cane River Bridge directly into St. Clair Avenue, eliminating the existing offset intersection. This alternative provides no temporary bridge, so traffic will be detoured during the construction process.

Alternative 4: This proposed alternative will demolish the existing two-lane Cane River Bridge and replace it along the same alignment.




FIGURE 1: Proposed Cane River Replacement Bridge on Skewed Alignment




FIGURE 2: Proposed Cane River Replacement Bridge on Same Alignment




FIGURE 3: Proposed Temporary Bridge at Touline Street

STAGE 0 ALTERNATIVES DEVELOPMENT

- The following early concepts, developed by the Natchitoches Bridge Taskforce, were analyzed as a part of the Stage 0 concepts:
 - Construction of a new bridge aligned with St. Clair Avenue utilizing either:
 - Phased construction maintaining traffic along the existing alignment, or
 - Construction of a temporary detour bridge at Highland Park.
 - Construction of a new bridge maintaining the existing alignment with a detour bridge at Highland Park.
- At the time the Stage 0 was produced, local governments discussed providing additional funding to construct a permanent bridge at Highland Park Bridge. This option was eliminated as the Natchitoches City Council voted against providing additional funds in December 2016.

SOLICITATION OF VIEWS (SOV)

- Preliminary project description and maps were sent by LADOTD on June 7, 2017.
- LADOTD mailed out 76 SOV letters to various federal, statewide, and local agencies required by the NEPA process.
- 18 agency responses and 41 citizen responses were received.
- 39 of the 41 citizen comments opposed a temporary bridge along Highland Park Drive.

STAGE 1 ALTERNATIVES DEVELOPMENT

- The alternatives that were determined to be reasonable and were presented at the first public meeting included versions of the three-lane (two through lanes, one center turning lane)
 - Alternate 1 Replace Cane River Bridge on a skewed alignment utilizing staged construction;
 - Alternate 1A Replace Cane River Bridge on a skewed alignment with a temporary bridge located at Highland Park;
 - Alternate 1B Replace Cane River Bridge on a skewed alignment with a temporary bridge located at Touline Street;
 - Alternate 2 Replace Cane River Bridge on the existing alignment utilizing staged construction;
 - Alternate 2A Replace Cane River Bridge on the existing alignment with a temporary bridge located at Highland Park; and
 - Alternate 2B Replace Cane River Bridge on the existing alignment with a temporary bridge located at Touline Street.

INITIAL PUBLIC MEETING

- The first public meeting was held on December 7, 2017.
- The meeting was attended by **71** citizens, **8** elected officials, 16 agency representatives, 3 media personnel, and 9 project team members.
- 47 public comments were received; 22 of the 47 comments opposed a temporary bridge along Highland
- Following the public meeting, the Highland Park temporary bridge was eliminated as a result of both documented public opposition and development of an additional alternative providing less impacts.



ALTERNATIVES REFINEMENT

- Through the feedback received throughout the Stage 1 process, the preliminary alternatives were further refined to 4 alternatives and the No-build. These alternatives are:
 - Replace existing Cane River Bridge along skewed alignment, providing a temporary bridge at Touline Street;
 - Replace existing Cane River Bridge along same alignment, providing a temporary bridge at Touline Street;
 - Replace existing Cane River Bridge along skewed alignment, with no temporary bridge;
 - Replace existing Cane River Bridge along same alignment, with no temporary bridge; and
 - No build.





- Land use in the area consists of developed land ranging from open space to high development and areas of water.

TRAVEL PATTERNS & ACCESSIBILITY

- During peak existing conditions, the intersections at both ends of the bridge experience significant delays and long queues, which are expected to increase in future conditions, due to increased volumes.
- Accessibility and traffic flow in the area would improve by providing a dedicated center turn-lane on the Cane River Bridge at Church Street.
- Short-term impacts would occur during construction; however, a sequencing plan will be developed during design to minimize traffic disruptions.
- A potential temporary no outlet location is proposed at Stephens Avenue onto Williams Avenue, and Touline Street will become a oneway eastbound temporarily if the temporary bridge alternative is selected. These temporary closures will result in detours consisting of at most 1-2 blocks.
- If no temporary bridge is constructed, traffic detouting is proposed during construction to the Pine Street Bridge.

TRAVEL OPERATIONS

- The Alternatives that propose a temporary bridge (Alternatives 1 and 2) provide the least impact on traffic operations.
- The Alternatives that do not propose a temporary bridge and instead proposes to detour traffic to the Pine Street Bridge (Alternatives 3 and 4) will increase delays. Travelers can expect the following delays:
 - 1-2 minutes turning off of side streets at Jefferson Street/Front Street,
 - Up to 4 minutes at Williams Avenue/Keyser Avenue, and
 - Up to 3 minutes at Keyser Avenue/Jefferson Street.
- Overall, depending on daily route, additional delays of approximately 10 minutes can be expected suring afternoon peak periods and 5-10 minutes during morning peak periods.




SAFETY

- High frequency of rear end crashes occur at the intersection of Front Street and Church Street and the intersection of Church Street/St. Clair
- Driver inattention and unexpected stopping within the queue were the primary factors attributing to the high rate of rear end crashes. The unexpected stopping can be attributed to traffic congestion and an abnormal intersection layout.
- Ways to improve traffic flow and safety include:
 - Accessibility can be increased with the addition of a two-way left turn to provide queue storage for left turning vehicles: Improving signal timing; and
 - Realigning the existing intersection.




NOISE AND AIR

- Temporary noise increases are anticipated during construction of the replacement and temporary bridges; however, the plans will include provisions requiring the contractor to minimize construction noise using noise abatement measures.
- The air quality study indicated the project will not violate air standards and it demonstrated that there would be no variation in the effects among the proposed alternatives.



WATERWAYS AND WATER QUALITY

- Adverse impacts to water quality will be reduced by application of Best Management Practices and adhering to an erosion and sedimentation control plan.
- The proposed project incorporates appropriately designed bridge structures that are not anticipated to impede the flow of waters.
- Drainage structures included in the design will mitigate any impacts to the floodplain.
- Applicable permits may be required.



VEGETATION

- The location of the bridge and its required clearance would result in the removal of several

WETLANDS AND WILDLIFE

- A routine wetland delineation and threatened and endangered species analysis was performed.
- No impacts to wetlands or threatened and endangered species are anticipated as a result of the alternatives.

Bridges

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CULTURAL RESOURCES

Front Street Brick Paving

- The brick paving of Front Street is a contributing element to the Historic Districts.
- The brick paved Front Street was newly reconstructed in 2008, which consisted
 of the removal and replacement of all existing bricks.



- Impacts to a portion of the existing brick are anticipated. The bricks will be carefully removed by hand and temporarily stored, and then will be reused as paving material to match as close as possible to the original configuration.
- Construction will follow a similar process to the methods used in 2008 to mitigate any impacts, so that minimal adverse effects will occur.

VIBRATION MONITORING

Per Section 804 of the 2016 Louisiana Standard Specifications for Roads and Bridges

- The substructure of the proposed Cane River Bridge will consist of drilled shafts and the potential temporary bridge at Touline Street will utilize steel H-piles, which both result in significantly less vibration during construction compared to conventional pile driving activities.
- It is expected that the construction techniques proposed for the project will cause the least impacts to surrounding sites.

RIGHT-OF-WAY AQUISITION

- Due to the proposed widening of the replacement bridge, land adjacent to the bridge will need to be acquired for right-of-way (ROW).
- Adjacent land to the existing Cane River Bridge, required for the project, is owned by the City of Natchitoches.
- A temporary construction servitude will be required along the Touline Street temporary bridge if the alternative is selected.
- There are no anticipated ROW impacts to land containing residential or commercial structures in the project vicinity.







BRIDGE REPLACEMENT ON SKEWED ALIGNMENT



















TYPICAL SECTION

PROPOSED PERMANENT CHURCH STREET BRIDGE







