

DOTD ADA Transition Plan Quick Guide

- The primary purpose of the Federal Highway Administration's (FHWA) Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) program is to ensure that pedestrians with disabilities have an equal opportunity to use the public rights-of-way in the transportation system.
- The ADA Transition Plan addresses and eliminates structural barriers associated with DOTD's public facilities to provide safe and accessible facilities and services to all citizens.
- As a state transportation agency, DOTD in accordance with ADA is responsible for pedestrian facilities on state owned roads for its programs and services to the public; and must have an ADA Transition Plan that:
 - Identifies barriers on State-owned roads, related facilities and DOTD offices that restrict accessibility to programs, services and activities by individuals with various disabilities.
 - Identifies accommodations and/or modifications that can be provided to make programs and services accessible
 - Evaluates the effectiveness of the accommodations or modifications in providing accessibility.
- DOTD staff are to utilize the ADA Transition Plan to identify and prioritize projects that correct non-compliant locations. To the extent possible, DOTD will prioritize the programming of ADA improvements.
