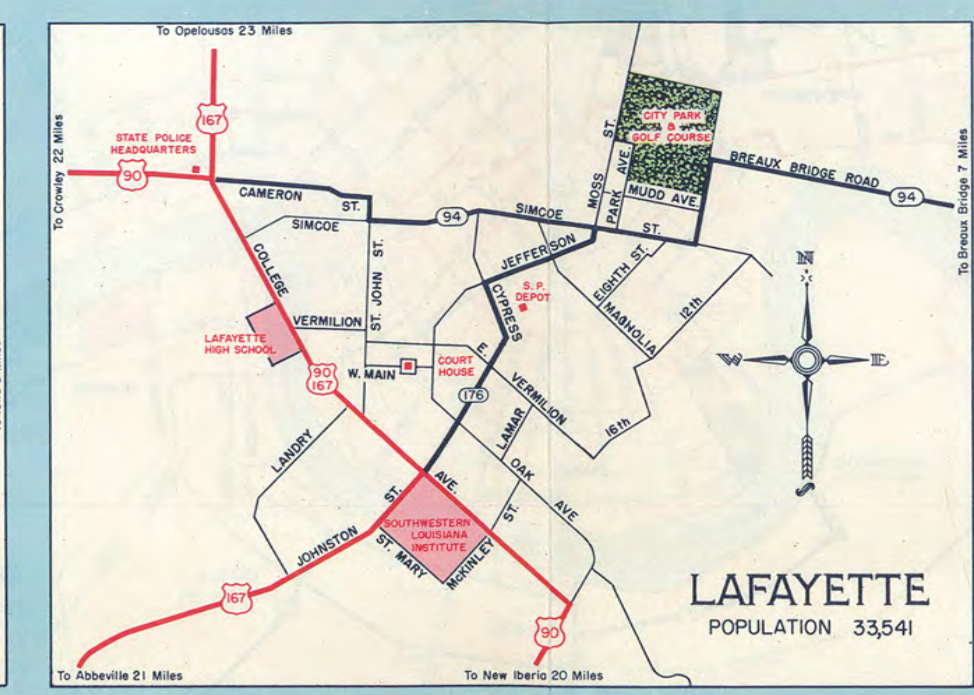
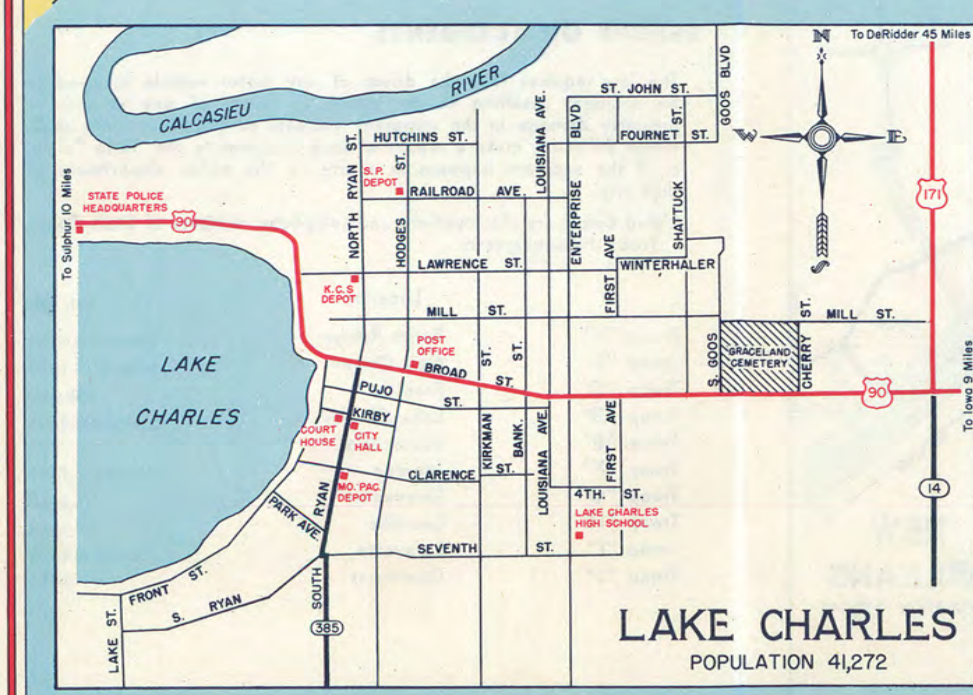
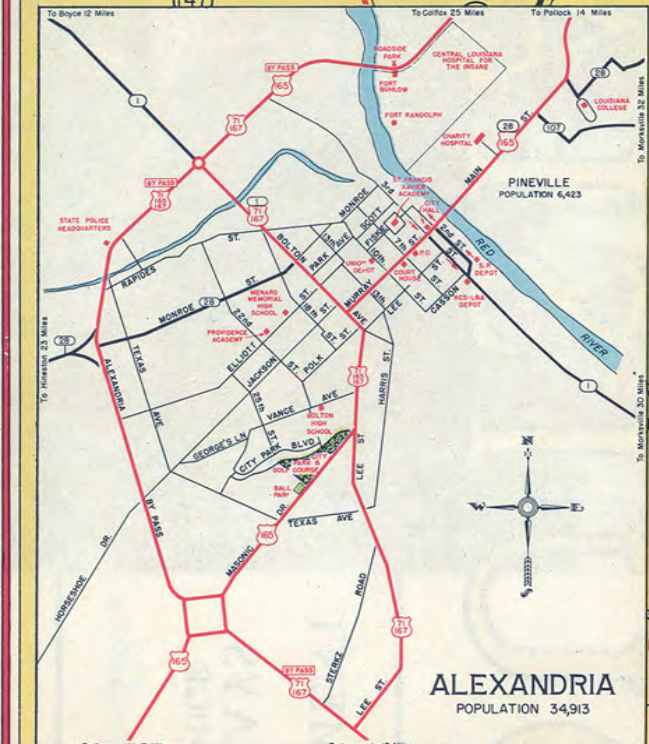
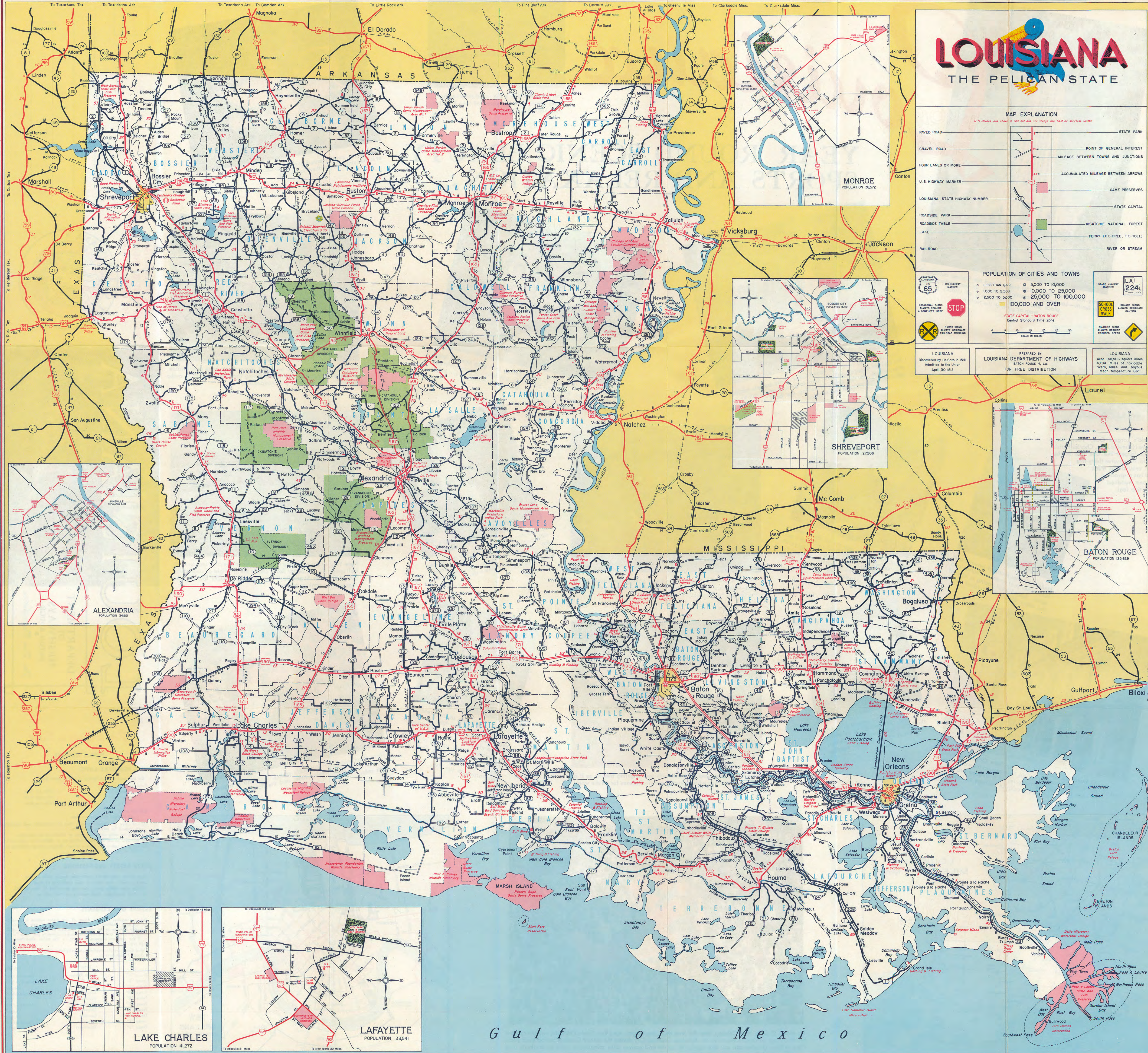
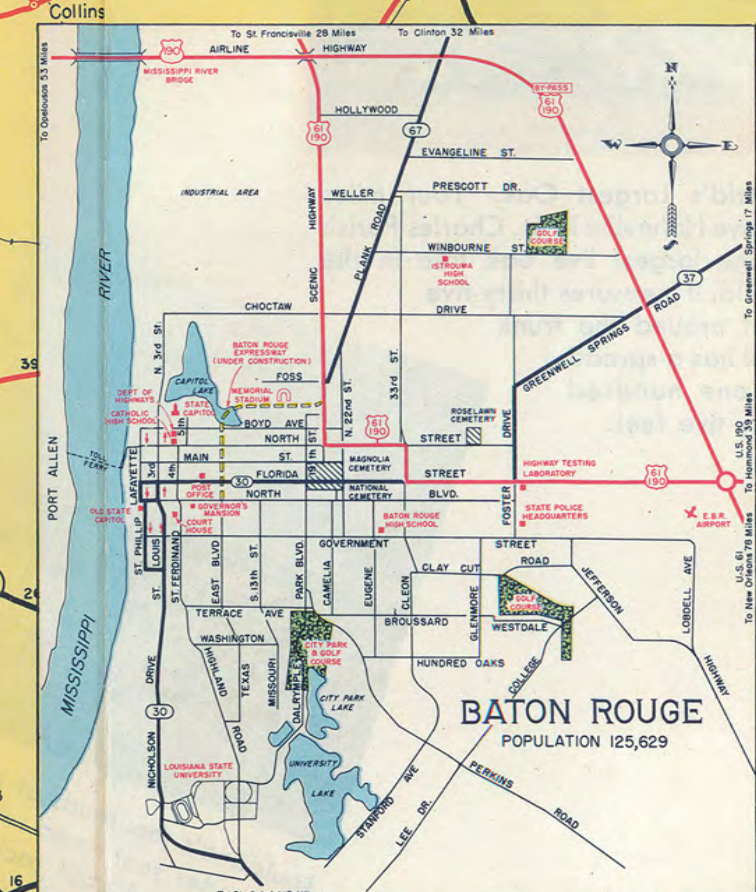
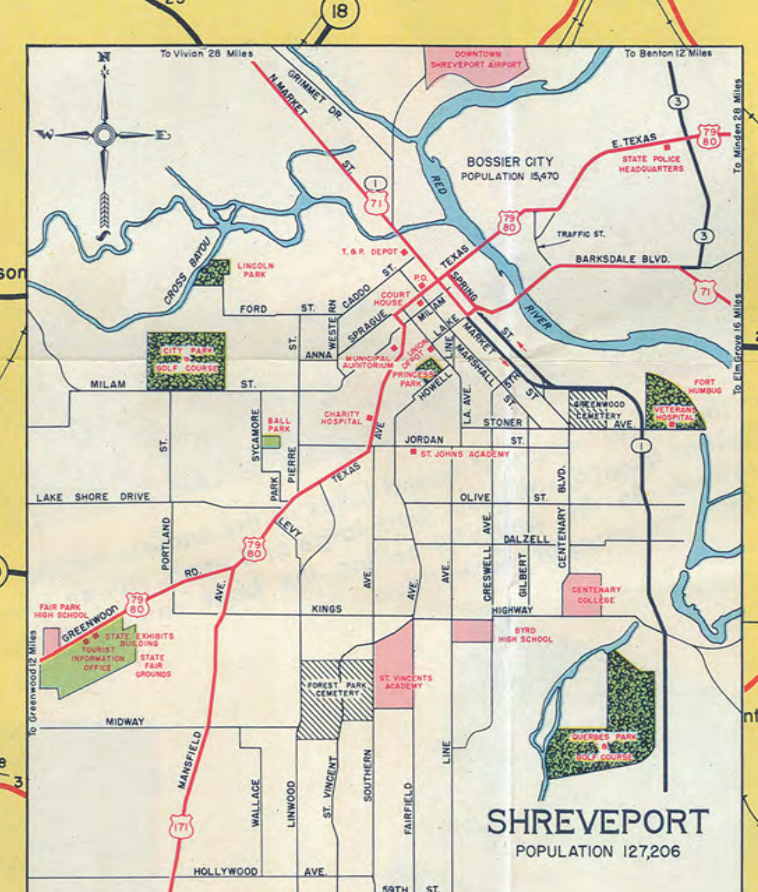
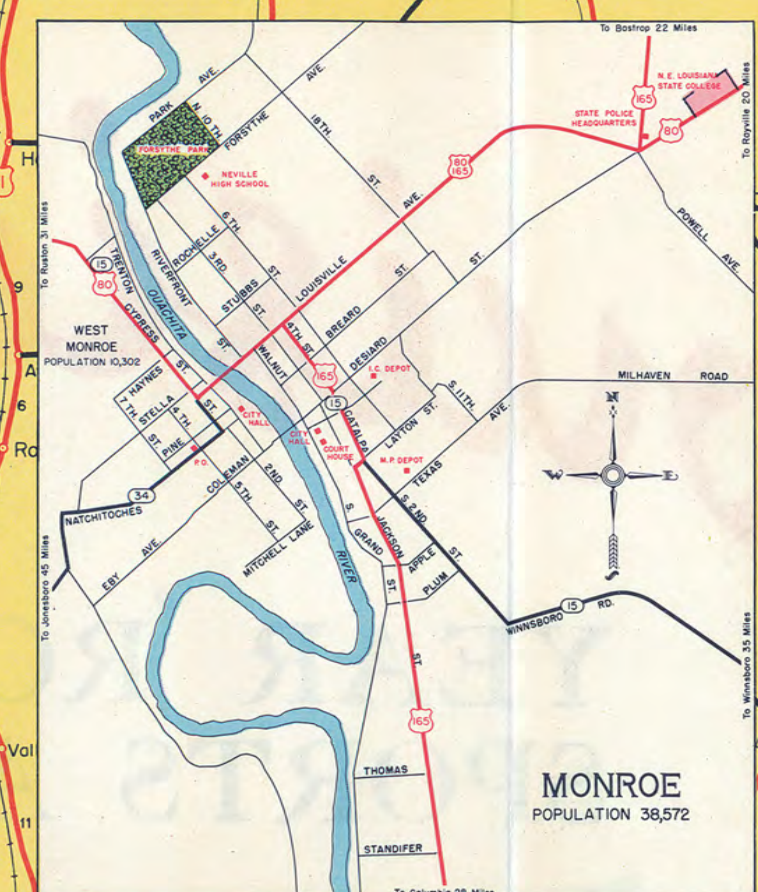
SCHOOL CROSS WALK
